Dr Sandra Bloom

'Parallel Processes of Abusive Power in Organizational Settings'

Dr. Sandra L. Bloom is an American Board-Certified Psychiatrist, Adjunct Professor in the School of Public Health at Drexel University, and from 1980 to 2001 served as Founder and Executive Director of the Sanctuary® inpatient psychiatric programmes for the treatment of trauma-related disorders in adults.

The Sanctuary Model is the only trauma –informed, systems model for children's residential treatment with an evidence base to support its implementation. The Sanctuary Network of approved programmes now includes residential, group home, juvenile justice, inpatient and outpatient centres for children, as well as substance abuse and inpatient programmes for adolescents and adults. Her first book, *Creating Sanctuary: Toward the Evolution of Sane Societies*, tells the story of the creation of one of the nation's first inpatient programs for the treatment of adults who were abused as children.

Dr Bloom is also a Fellow of the College of Physicians of Philadelphia, President of Community Works, and is a Past-President of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS). She now serves on the Board of the Institute for Safe Families in Philadelphia and also co-chairs a Trauma Task Force for the City. She maintains a website at www.sanctuaryweb.com.

Dr Noreen Tehrani

'Bullying–The Hidden Trauma'

Dr Noreen Tehrani formed her own company in 1997 to assist organisations to deal with a wide range of psychological problems including long-term sickness absence, stress, bullying and trauma. She is a Chartered Occupational, Counselling and Health Psychologist and her latest book *Workplace Trauma – concepts, assessment and intervention* was published in September 2004

Dr Tehrani also has a keen interest in debriefing training and is the trainer for the Northern Ireland Fire Brigade, Metropolitan Police, City Police and Euro Tunnel. She also chaired a British Psychological Society working party on trauma debriefing.

Dr Derek Farrell

'Sexual Abuse Perpetrated by Roman Catholic Priests and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder'

Dr Derek Farrell has been a Mental Health Practitioner for over twenty years and in 2003 completed his PhD, which was based upon survivor's experience of sexual abuse perpetrated by clergy and religious. He is UKCP and BABCP Accredited Psychotherapist, and an EMDR Europe Approved Consultant and Trauma Therapist. He is also a previous President of EMDR UK & Ireland.

Before moving in to academia Dr Farrell was a Clinical Nurse Specialist in Psychotherapy specialising in psychological trauma and also worked for four years for the Police Rehabilitation and Retraining Trust, Belfast, Northern Ireland, treating serving and non-serving officers of the former Royal Ulster Constabulary [now Northern Ireland Police Federation].

Dr Stuart Turner

'Assessment and Treatment of Survivors of Torture'

Dr Turner is Consultant Psychiatrist at the Trauma Clinic in London and is one of the four clinicians who established the European Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ESTSS).

He is a Trustee of the Medical Foundation for the Care of Victims of Torture and has been a pioneer in the field of psychological trauma, helping to develop evidence- based services for survivors of adversity in the UK and internationally. Dr Turner has also recently been elected as President of the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS) for 2008.

Dr Turner is a former Trustee of Redress, an organisation working for reparation for survivors of torture. Redress was one of the NGOs involved in the Pinochet extradition trial representing the victims of torture in Chile. He is also Chair of Trustees of the Refugee Therapy Centre, a London-based service specialising in offering same language counselling for young refugees and asylum seekers.
